THE GENESIS PEACE HUB

Already functioning virtually, our new physical space will convene, incubate, catalyze, and accelerate all our peacebuilding activities. Its mindful design as a circular economy will help sustain itself.

AT ALL GENESIS PEACE HUB SITES:

- Continuation of our vibrant array of arts and culture programs.
- Educational offerings scaled to include expanded leadership and vocational training along with more internships.
- **Research Incubator** – for academic studies on creativity and leadership with our joint university research partners at University of Pennsylvania, DePaul, Indiana University Lilly Family School of Philanthropy, and Stanford University School of Medicine Center for Compassion and Altruism.
- **Over 65 community partnerships** – this vibrant array of social justice, human rights, arts, education, media, and environmental sustainability organizations will help us take community issues and peacebuilding to the policy level.

NEW FEATURES

- **Social Entrepreneurship Center** – incubates social impact businesses and spins them off the Peace Hub as for-profit entities managed by the community for the good of the community. They each give back 10% to the Peace Hub.
- **Teaching Farm** – generates working solutions for food justice, public health, access issues, and nutrition while pioneering agricultural innovation. The farm will also source the Peace Hub and surrounding communities.
- **Sports and Social Change Program** – large-scale sports offerings teach leadership and team building via sports/leagues.

EXPANDING OUR GLOBAL FOOTPRINT OF PEACEBUILDING PROGRAMS



An Ecosystem Of Six Interconnected Locations

To be physically located on four continents,
its phased growth over five years starts with Chicago in 2025.

NORTH AMERICA (Chicago)

EUROPE (Berlin, Germany and Normandy, France)

AFRICA (Mauritius and Kumasi, Ghana)*

and eventually

OCEANIA (New Zealand)

* NOTE: Only the two African sites need a built environment

NORTH AMERICA - Chicago

- Nested within an existing Chicago theater, this site is housed as leased space.
- Social Entrepreneurship Center - dedicated to social impact business development in arts, culture, and social justice.
- Beginning with this location, we will develop and action the Genesis Task Force on Violence and Public Health's strategic roadmap to mitigate violence and ameliorate its public health fallout.

EUROPE – Normandy, France

- Situated within The Normandy Institute's Education Center.
- Environmental sustainability centered on food justice, farm-to-table best practices.
- Part-time smaller location to start.

EUROPE – Berlin, Germany

- Genesis' Executive Director is adjunct faculty teaching place-making and peacebuilding at HTW Berlin University. (In active discussions to be in-residence at this tech university.)
- Social Entrepreneurship Center - focused on technology for peacebuilding.
- No sports programs or teaching farm at this site.

AFRICA – Kumasi, Ghana*

- The Queen Mother of Ghana gifted a plot of land to Genesis for our Peace Hub site.
- Social Entrepreneurship Center - focused on arts and culture and environmental sustainability in service of well-being, healing and peacebuilding.
- Core focus on public health and social justice. (No direct medical services.)
- This will be a smaller African satellite site at the start.

AFRICA – Moka Smart City, Mauritius*

- Situated on a transformed sugarcane plantation, this site convenes thought leaders in environmental sustainability with educational opportunities.
- Features a retreat center for peacebuilders to enable them to restore and renew.
- Partners with existing state-of-the-art athletic facilities for our Sports & Social Change Program.
- Three-acre farm to work on agricultural innovation and food justice; sources the Genesis Peace Hub and surrounding communities.
- Genesis is launching a cross-cultural collaborative competition for a sustainable building design.

OCEANIA – New Zealand

- Nelson or Wellington are preferred locations.
- This last Genesis Peace Hub component to be developed in our ecosystem will be informed by the trajectory of the other sites.



GENESIS ACADEMY SUMMER INSTITUTE

15-20 Students from Chicago, Other Parts of the US, and Around the World

Marking its 10th anniversary, this program now draws students from over 37 countries with an applicant pool that has more than quintupled in size and continues to grow.

The Summer Institute brings together American students, ages 15-19, to join with others from international areas of conflict. They live and learn together in four curricular areas: **Heroes and Human Rights, Music and Peacebuilding, Environmental Sustainability, and Peace Journalism**. These four programmatic areas will grow into peacebuilding and leadership trainings. The students meet with thought leaders, activists, and artists, and participate in an array of experiential learning opportunities and field studies to examine forces that come into play in cycles both perpetuating and dismantling conflict. With the arts thread throughout the program, students work to explore their individual voice, collective humanity, and the daunting issues we all face here, across the US, and as a global community. SAFFRON CARAVAN

Our multicultural professional music ensemble exemplifies our work of arts diplomacy by uniting artists from Iran, Afghanistan, Cuba, Morocco, India, the Middle East, Europe, Brazil, Venezuela, and the US for cross-cultural collaborative performances, music education, and roundtables on music and peacebuilding. Saffron Caravan demonstrates how the arts offer an ideal creative and neutral environment in which artists and audiences can set aside their differences, break down barriers, and work together.

A sacred shared space provided by GATC for dialogue, exchange, breaking down barriers, and working together to share their common humanity while respectfully contributing both individual and collective voices/talent to art. Saffron Caravan performed and delivered music education programs across the US (Washington D.C., Chicago and San Diego) and internationally in Morocco, the Middle East, and Bosnia. Their extended artist-in-residencies in Chicago impacted 1,000+ of Chicagoland's at-risk youth and families as well as refugee youth. They performed in conjunction with the Chicago Council on Global Affairs' Forum on Global Cities and WBEZ Worldview's 25th anniversary with a program at the DuSable Museum of Black History (a Smithsonian Museum).

SOUNDS OF HEALING

Multicultural musical experience for and about healing includes Saffron Caravan collaboration with youth talent (Genesis Academy Summer Institute graduates) and two Chicagoland blues/jazz legends.

In 2020, during the pandemic we orchestrated a 33-person creative collaboration including, 31 artists from 17 countries, and reached over 10,000 people virtually in over 35 countries.

- World Premiere live, in-person at Chicago's Adler Planetarium (June 2022).
- Programs for at-risk youth and families/refugees from Chicago's SW side, June 2022 in Jackson Park; June 2023 for those from Marillac St. Vincent Family Services and After School Matters.
- 2024 onwards - Sounds of Healing in our Neighborhoods includes companion roundtable programs with marginalized youth on Chicago's SW sides, refugees, and others. Nov. 2024 kicks off our partnership with Forward Momentum Chicago.
- Our lyrics competition helps participants self-actualize through a creative process.

GENESIS PEACE EMPOWERMENT FUND

Genesis' successful evacuation of our 2016 Genesis Academy Summer Institute graduate from Kabul, Afghanistan in 2021 prompted more opportunities to help others. We created this fund to raise critical financial support and awareness for educational programs, healing initiatives (not direct medical services), and paid internships, and job opportunities.

MEMORIAL FUNDS

The Harold Ramis Legacy Fund

In memory of Genesis' beloved Board Member of eight years, this fund is being used to create a Genesis Peace Hub Film and Theater Program on Comedy and Conflict Resolution.

Mohammad Arif Noorzai Memorial Sports Fund

In memory of Herat University (Afghanistan) Professor, Soccer Coach, and Rotary Peace Fellow in Genesis ED's cohort who was destined for teaching on the Genesis Peace Hub, but tragically had his life cut short by the Taliban.

John B. Lazar Memorial Mentoring Fund

Immortalizes the illustrious career of this executive coach, mentor, and prolific writer whose life was cut short by illness. John's future had included serving as a mentor/coach and coaching the other mentors at our Genesis Peace Hub in Chicago and around the world.

Edwin Rosen Art Trust Bequest

Chicagoland's renowned artist, the late Edwin Rosen donated 325 paintings as a bequest to Genesis. Proceeds from the painting sales benefit the Genesis Peace Hub and Summer Institute arts programs. (2025 event details TBA)
